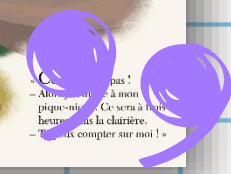
## TORTUE EST TOUJOURS EN RETARD Turtle is always late

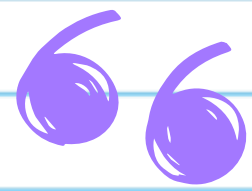
It's so hard for Turtle not to be late... Whether it's for games, snacks, or unusual discoveries, she always arrives when everything is finished!

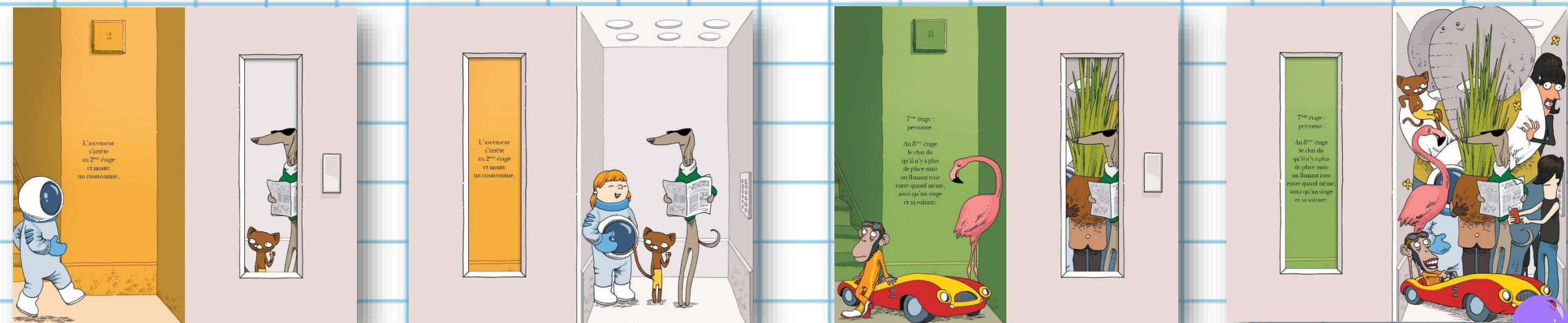
## L'ASCENSEUR The Elevator

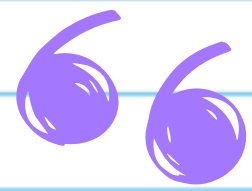

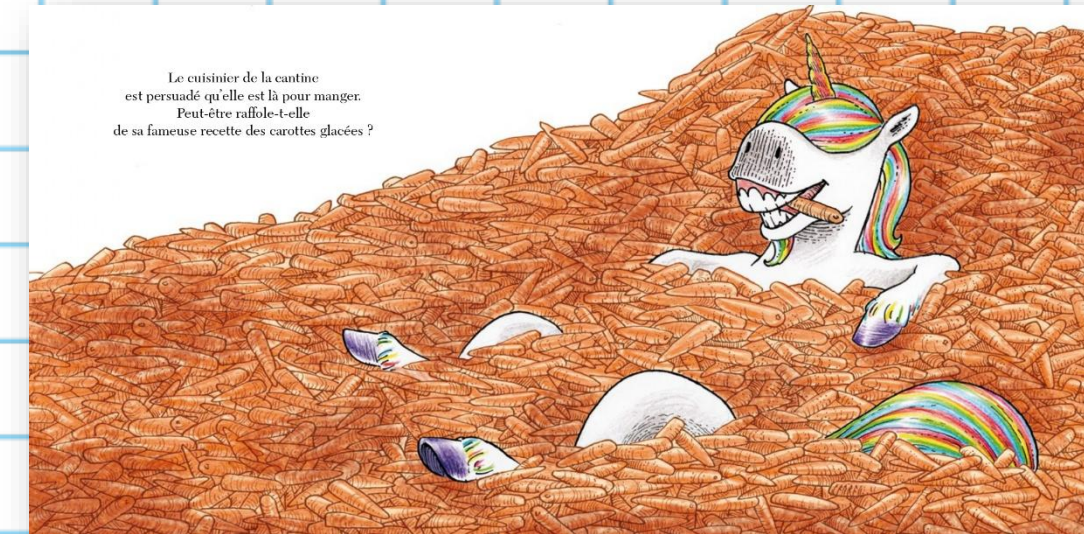

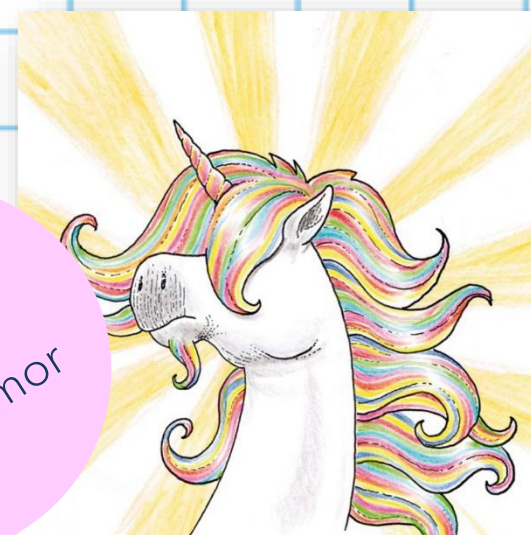
## UNE LICORNE A L'ECOLE A Unicorn at School

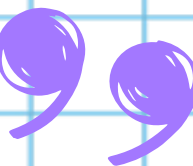

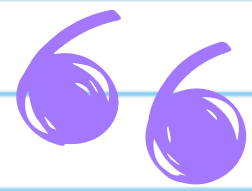

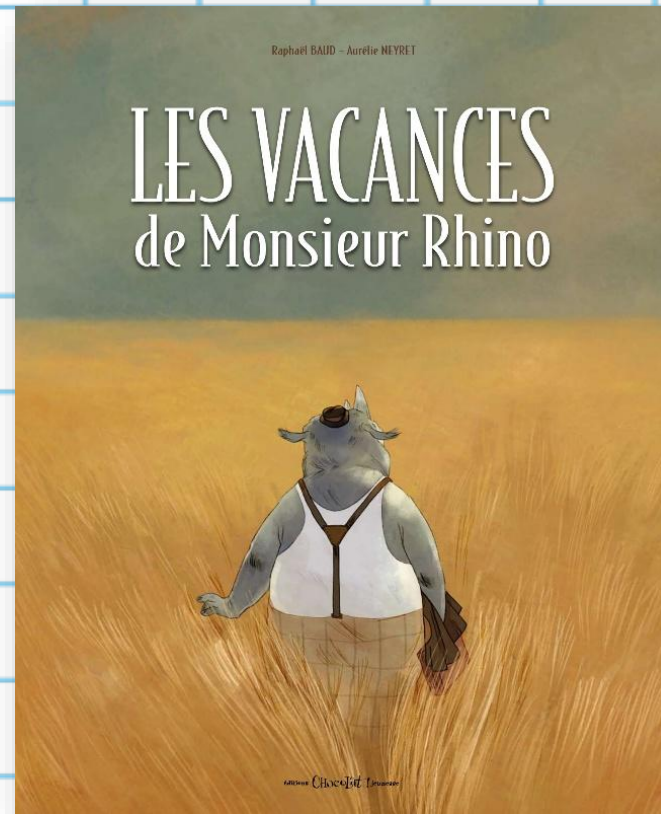

"Zoo animals, really, it's their job. And from time to time, they take a little vacation."

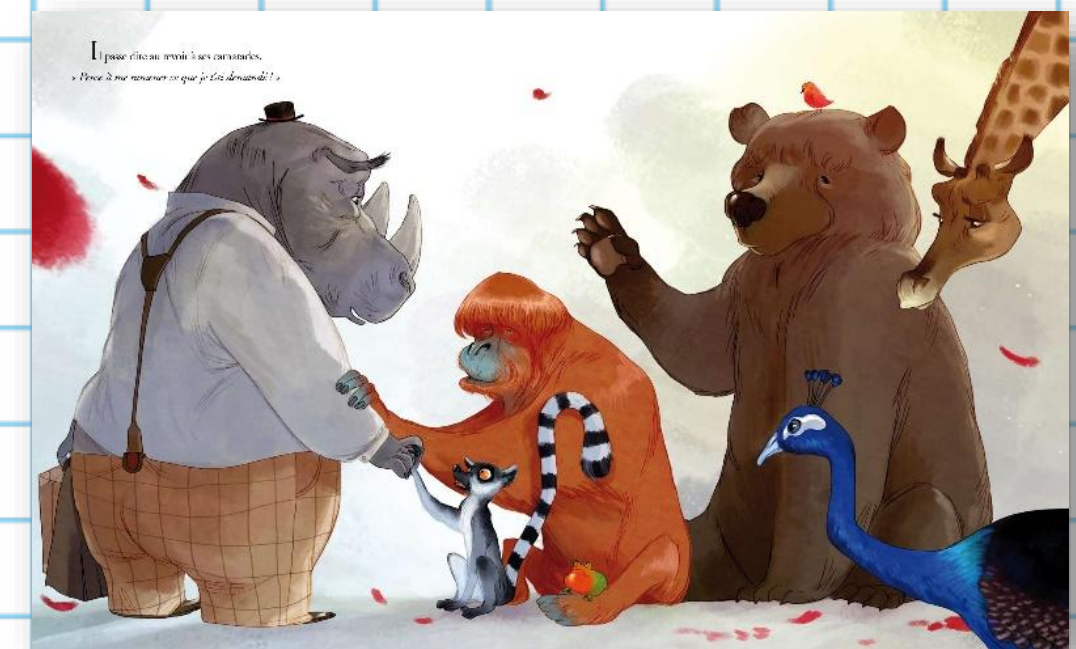
And here we are, following in the footsteps of Mr. Rhino, impassively setting off to relax for two weeks in Africa.

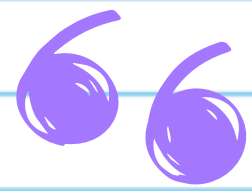

## MONSIEUR WALTER Mr. Walter

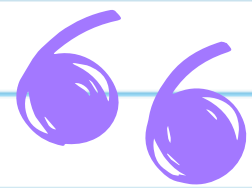

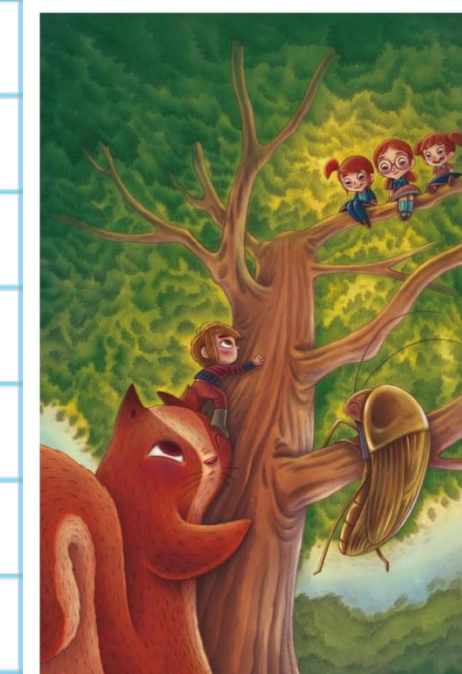
## ZAC Zac

- Dreamlike and bright!



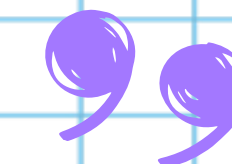

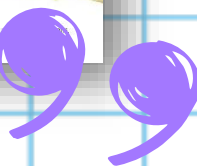
## PERSONNE Nobody

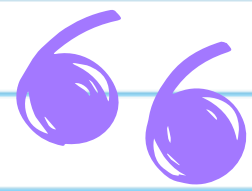

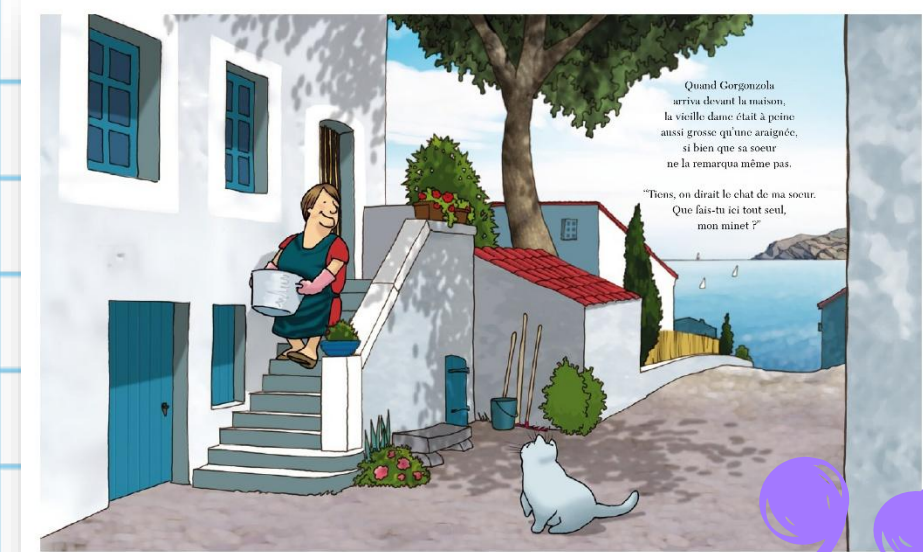
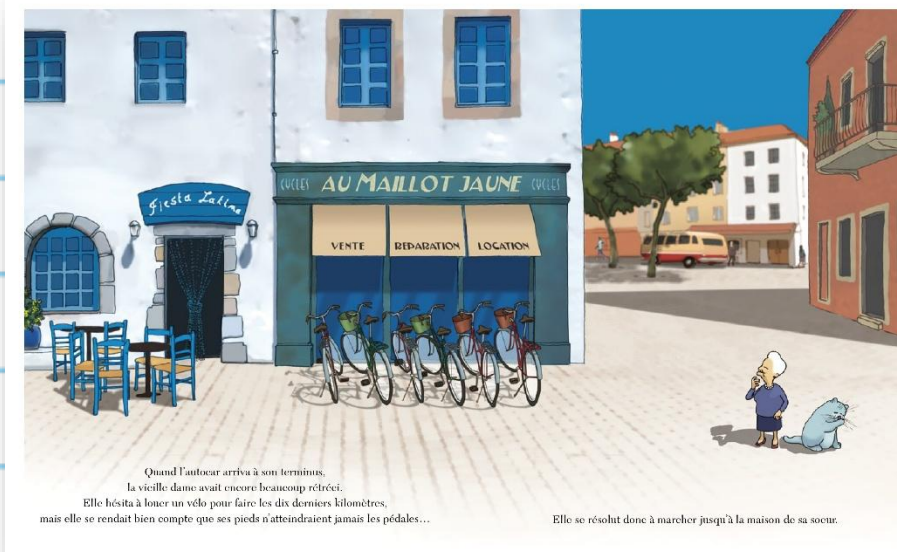
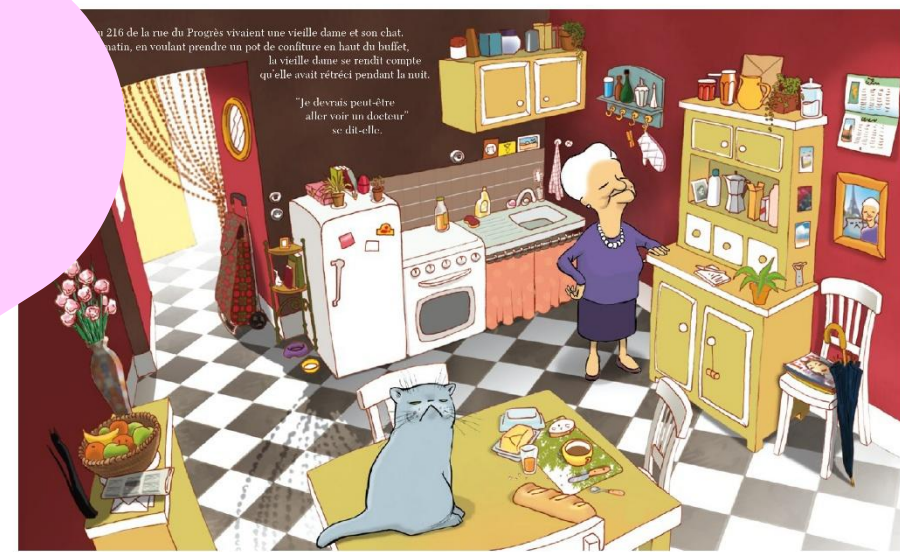
## LA VIEILLE DAME QUI RAPETISSAIT The Old Lady Who Shrunk

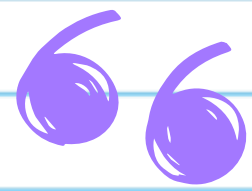
One morning, in a sad part of a big city, an old woman realizes she is slowly shrinking...

- A trip-like journey mixing humor, poetry and optimism!



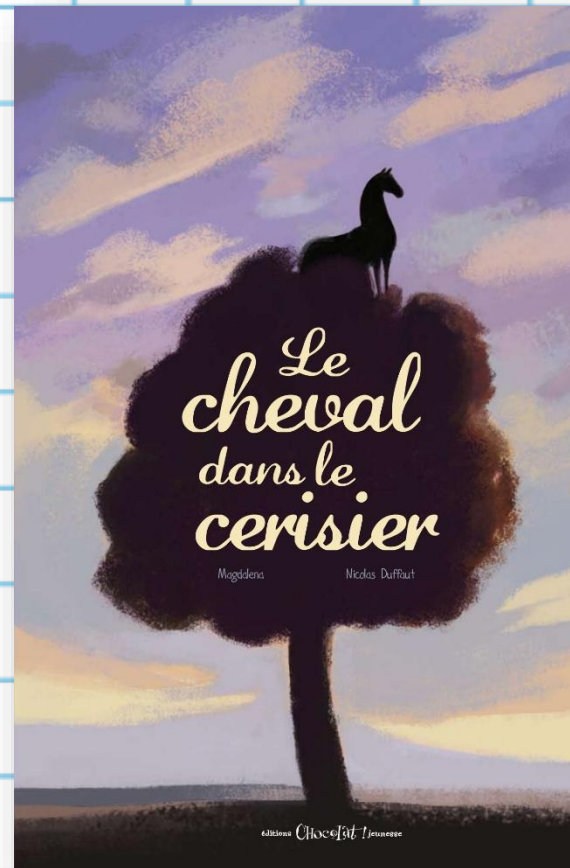

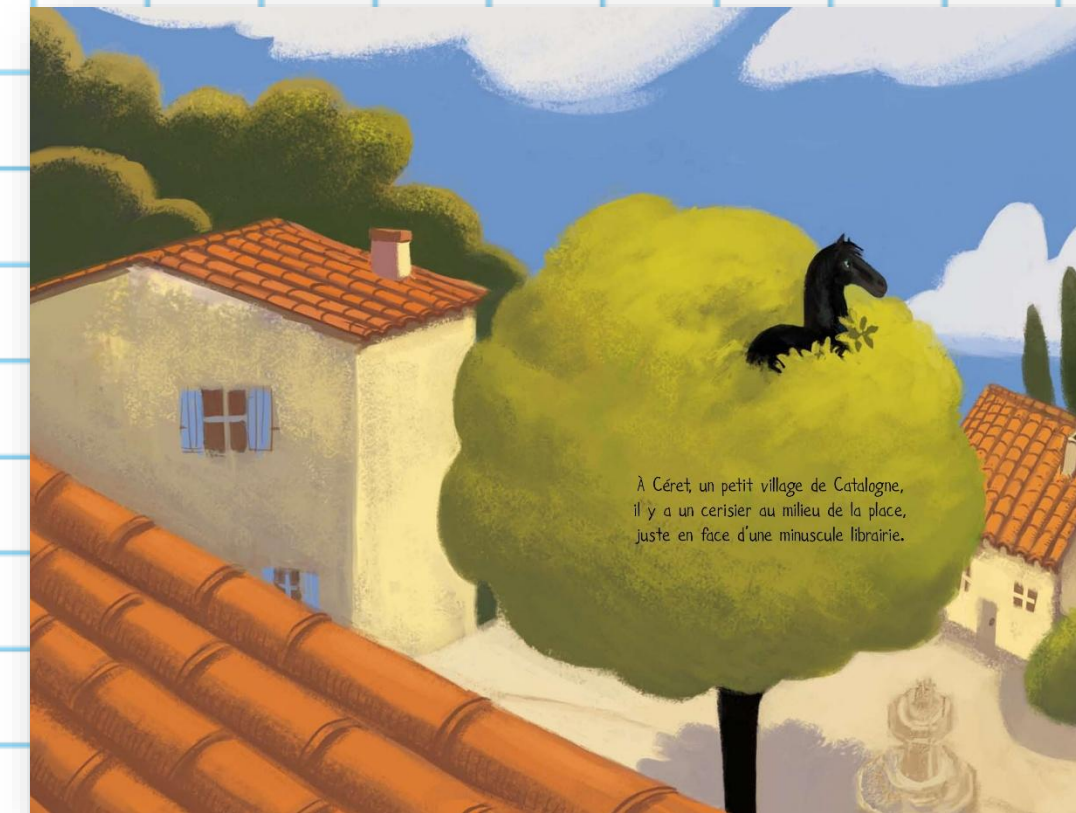

## LE CHEVAL DANS LE CERISIER The Horse in the Cherry Tree

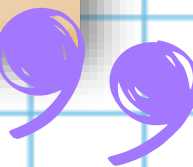
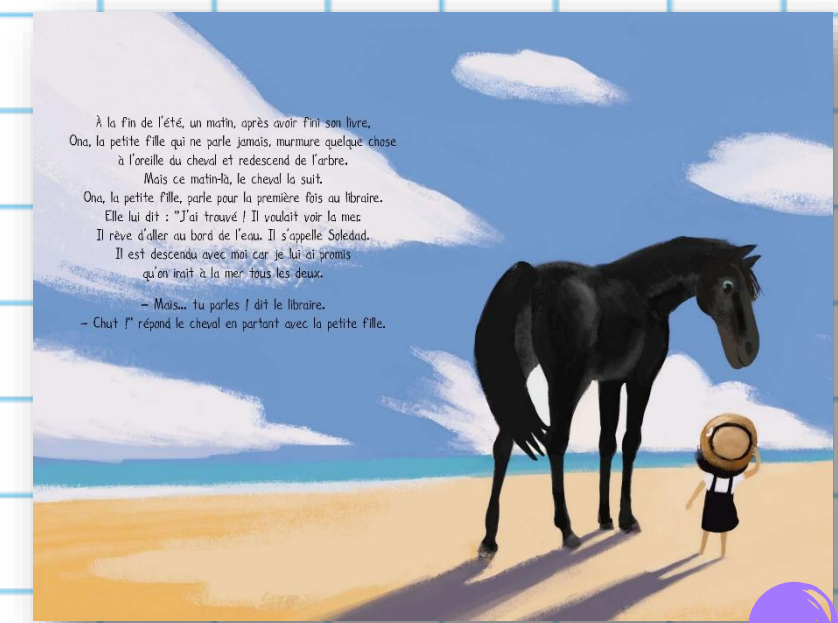

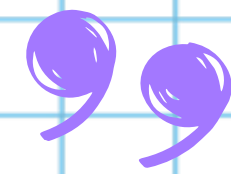
## LA COLLECTION DE MIETTES The Collection of Crumbs
