Candid...or just a little silly, the little rabbit thus invites half the forest's villains, all of whom are obviously ready to make him their afternoon snack...



While wandering aimlessly through a city that could be any city, Zac encounters a host of unexpected characters:


A giant squirrel, a golden cockroach, three little girls, a pelican...


Each one takes turns joining the stroll, because together, everything is always better than alone.



DEUX JARDINIERS


Two Gardeners



Then begins a long journey, all the longer as she keeps getting smaller, alongside her big gray cat who, for his part, seems more and more enormous...





LE CHEVAL DANS LE CERISIER The Horse in the Cherry Tree




